
AUSTIN NEIGHBORHOOD SPOTLIGHT: GEORGETOWN

DID YOU KNOW?

Georgetown is one of the few locations in the United States where red poppies reseed themselves from year to year. Because of this, Georgetown is celebrated as the **Red Poppy Capital of the Lone Star State.**

They originally came to Georgetown when a young soldier sent home seeds from Flanders' Fields during WVVI, and the Red Poppies began to grow wild across the area.



The town even hosts a **Red Poppy Festival** every April with a parade, car show, food, live music and crafts.
